





Dr. Jean Wright

Currently, she is a member of the American Association of Christian Counselors and the American Association of Black African American Christian Counselors. Dr. Wright is licensed and certified by the QPR Suicide Prevention Institute as a Community Gatekeeper Instructor. In 2016, Dr. Wright established the Virtual Dialysis Support Center, Inc. (VDSC), a 501c3, community-based nonprofit whose mission it is to raise the quality of life for dialysis patients, transplant patients, and caregivers. Dr. Wright has certified over 20 Peer Mentors, and the VDSC services eight area dialysis clinics and 16 senior citizen complexes, providing peer support, community health guidance, and resource information.

Daicia Price serves as a clinical assistant professor of social work at University of Michigan School of School Work. Daicia has gained clinical and macro practice experience in juvenile justice, community mental health, housing, schools and foster care.
